There is no participation fee.

Participants may obtain funding for travel to and accommodation in Hagen through Erasmus+ short-term mobility funding from their home institution (Erasmus+ BIP, 3 ECTS). After receiving confirmation of participation, participants can apply for this funding at their home university.

Participants will be able to apply for additional OpenEU funding for underrepresented student groups. A hostel in Hagen will be reserved.
